Eligibility Requirements & Pathways to Certification

Key Eligibility Requirements for Addiction Medicine Exam

- Current certification by any of the ABMS Member Boards or the AOA
- Medical degree or equivalent
- Medical licensure: current, unrestricted and valid in US or Canada in all jurisdictions where the physician is licensed
- Training or experience in Addiction Medicine
 - Practice Pathway
 - ACGME-Accredited Fellowship in Addiction Medicine

Practice Pathway

- Provides opportunity for physicians who have significant Addiction Medicine practice experience or training but who have not completed an ACGME-accredited Addiction Medicine fellowship to qualify for the certification exam
- Practice Pathway will be open through 2025 Exam Cycle

Practice Pathway: Time in Practice

- 1,920 hours of relevant practice in ADM at the subspecialty level
 - Completed over at least 24 months
 - Need not be continuous, but must be within 60 months immediately preceding June 30 of the application year
- Broad-based, professional activity with significant addiction medicine responsibility
 - Clinical care including prevention and treatment of individuals at risk for substance use disorders (minimum 480 hours)
 - Teaching, research and/or administration activities (maximum 1,440 hours)

ACGME-Accredited Fellowship Pathway

- Successful completion of a minimum of 12 months of ACGME-accredited fellowship training
 - If fellowship program is approved for more than 12 months of training, successful completion of all years of training for which the fellowship program is accredited
- Addiction Medicine fellowship programs began accreditation process through ACGME in February 2018

Examination Content, Questions & Timeline

Exam Content

Assesses ability to apply knowledge rather than recall of isolated facts

 Focuses on high-frequency and/or high-impact patient problems

• Emphasizes clinical situations and decisions arising in the experienced addiction medicine specialist's practice

Exam Questions

- Multiple choice questions; single-best answer
- Types of Multiple-Choice Questions
 - Recall: specific important facts
 - Interpretation: e.g., identify a fatal study flaw, diagnose a patient
 - **Problem Solving**: e.g., judgment about clinical treatment, healthcare administration, study design, 2x2 tables, etc.
- Calculator, drug name list, and normal range values provided

What is NOT on the Exam?

• True/False items

• K-type questions: choose appropriate set of correct answers

Trick questions

• "Experimental" questions

Exam Timeline

- Late October early November: all exams administered
- November/December: all exams scored
- December/January: Key validation process
 - Each question's performance reviewed
 - Focus on low-performing question
 - Questions may be retained, re-keyed, or dropped based on performance
 - Each candidate's exam is then rescored
- January: Board reviews exam results and characteristics
 - Scores equated to a standardized score so passing standard represents the same level of proficiency year after year
 - Eliminates effects of variance in exam difficulty from year to year

Certificate

- Attests that all requirements of Certification in the Specialty/Subspecialty have been met.
- Dated January 1 of the year after the exam.
 - Subject to continuing compliance with Continuing Certification Program (CCP) requirements, Certificate will expire December 31, ten years after issuance
 - E.g., for those passing the 2023 examination, the effective date of the Certification will be January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2033.
- All Addiction Medicine Diplomates Certified by the ABPM are subject to the Annual Fee



Comparison of Applications Submitted 2020 to 2022




Total of Applications Submitted Per Year



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
ABPM Exam Registrations: 2013-2022

Continuing Certification Program – Three Phase Plan

Three Phase Implementation of CCP

• Phase 1 – January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2024

• Phase 2 – January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2029

• Phase 3 – January 1, 2030, to December 31, 2039

Phase 1 Requirements

January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2024

Review of Professional Standing

At all times, ABPM Diplomates shall be required to maintain a <u>full, valid, and unrestricted license to practice medicine</u> in all states, territories or jurisdictions for which the Diplomate has a license to practice medicine.

Lifelong Professional Development

- 20 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits*™ between January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2023
 - 6 of the 20 CME Credits must be specific to the Diplomate's ABPM Certification(s)
- 20 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits*™ between January 1, 2024, and December 31, 2024
 - 6 of the 20 CME Credits must be specific to the Diplomate's ABPM Certification(s)
- Diplomates shall attest annually to completion of the CME requirement via the online "Attestation Form" on the ABPM Physician Portal.
- No audits will be conducted during Phase 1

Phase 2 Requirements

January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2029

Review of Professional Standing

At all times, ABPM Diplomates shall be required to maintain a <u>full, valid, and unrestricted license to practice medicine</u> in all states, territories or jurisdictions for which the Diplomate has a license to practice medicine.

Lifelong Professional Development

- 20 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits*™ annually regardless of the number of ABPM Certificates.
 - 6 of the 20 CME credits must be specific to a Diplomate's ABPM Certification(s).
- Diplomates shall attest annually to completion of the CME requirement via the online "Attestation Form" on the ABPM Physician Portal.
- ABPM shall audit up to 5% of attestations for compliance.
 - Audits demonstrating non-compliance will result in Suspension of Diplomate's ABPM Certification(s).
 - Diplomate shall have a period of six-months to complete the "missed" CME requirement.
 - Diplomates who timely complete "missed" CMEs will be subject to automatic audit for the next 2 calendar years.
 - If a Diplomate has not completed the "missed" CME requirement in the six-month period, that Diplomate's Certification(s) shall be Revoked and the Diplomate will be subject to re-entry requirements.

LAP Transition Plan (Jan 1, 2025-Dec 31, 2029)

- All Time-Limited Diplomates shall be required to participate in the LAP.
- Answer 30 Specialty/Subspecialty questions annually
 - <u>Diplomate with Multiple ABPM Certifications MUST participate in LAP for each Certificate</u>
- Open-book: reference materials may be consulted
- There will be no time limit for a Diplomate's response to an individual LAP item
 - Once a Diplomate "opens an item" the Diplomate must answer and cannot close the item (by closing the browser window) prior to submitting a response. Doing so will result in the response being marked incorrect.
- The extended LAP Pilot will be subject to industry-standard psychometric analysis for longitudinal assessment platforms. Each year a Minimum Passing Score (MPS) shall determine if a participating Diplomate achieves an MPS during the extended LAP Pilot.
- Diplomates who fail to meet the MPS in 4 of the 5 administrations during Phase 2 shall be required to participate in a Remediation Activity.

Phase 3 Requirements

January 1, 2030, to December 31, 2039

Continuous Certification Process

- CCP Requirements in Phase III
 - Pay Administrative Fee <u>Annual</u>
 - Maintain a full, valid & unrestricted license to practice medicine Annual
 - Complete 20 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™ Annual
 - Participate in LAP by answering 30 questions (untimed & open book) Annual
 - Diplomate must complete one IHHC Activity designed to positively impact & improve a Diplomate's practice <u>1x/5-year period</u>
